SKETCH

Joseph J. Phillips (1898–1940) was born in Wabash County, Indiana. When he enlisted in the U.S. Army in December 1917, he was living in Fairfield, Ohio, and listed his occupation as chauffer. Phillips served with AEF in France from July–December 1918, as a member of the 42nd and 211th Aero Squadrons.

Upon his return to the United States, Phillips moved to Ohio County, West Virginia, where he married Bernice Rebecca Farmer in August 1921. A short time later, the couple moved to North Manchester, Wabash County, Indiana. From there they moved to Bedford, Lawrence County, Indiana, and from there to Indianapolis. Joseph Phillips died from rectal cancer on 30 October 1940.

Bernice Rebecca Farmer Phillips (1901–1959) was born in Benwood, Marshall County, West Virginia. After the death of her husband, she remained in Indianapolis and listed her occupation as housewife.
