HISTORICAL SKETCH

Poets' Corner, Inc. was founded by Olive Inez Downing in Indianapolis in 1942. Downing also served as the club's first president. The club promoted poetry and had monthly meetings. It featured various speakers and sponsored Riley Red Rose Day, a poetic tribute to Riley held at his tomb in Crown Hill every year. For a time, the club housed a collection of rare books at its headquarters.
