HISTORICAL SKETCH

Indiana has always been a crossroads for many railroad lines. Its peak railroad transportation years were from the end of the nineteenth century through about World War I. There was also a small boom of railroad use in Indiana in the mid-to-late 1930s, leading up to World War II.

Railroads were the primary mail transportation from post-Civil War to around World War II, when planes and vehicles became the dominant transportation.
