## SKETCH

Redmon [Redmond] Spurlock (16 September 1844—8 March 1893) was born to William Spurlock and his unidentified first wife in Patoka Township, Dubois County, Indiana. He was one of eight siblings. The census records seem to indicate that William Spurlock later remarried to a woman named Mary, and the couple potentially had five to six more children together.

Redmon Spurlock married Francis E. Vaughan on 21 August 1865 in Dubois County, and the couple had six children— three sons (Elmer, Solomon, Willard) and three daughters (Minerva, Sarah, Sylvia). Redmon Spurlock worked as a farmer and taught Sunday school classes, as well as serving as a Justice of the Peace.
