## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

The author of the diary was the great-grandfather of the donor along the maternal line. He had a daughter named Louisa Rudin, who married Charles Kuster. Louisa then divorced and lived in Tell City, Indiana, with her daughter Alma Kuster.

Alma married John D. Jarboe and had a daughter named Maytha Jarboe. Maytha then married Philip Walker. The great-grandfather most likely originated from Bern, Switzerland.

Tell City is in Troy Township of Perry County, Indiana. It is the seat Perry County. It was founded in 1858 by Swiss and German immigrants and named after Swiss folk hero, William Tell.
