BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Samuel Brenton (22 November 1810-4 March 1857) was born in Gallatin County, Kentucky, where he attended public schools and was ordained as a minister in the Methodist Church in 1830. He served in the Indiana House of Representatives, 1838-1841, after which he returned to ministry until he had a paralytic stroke in 1848. Brenton served as a Congressman in the 32nd (Whig Party), 34th (Opposition Party), and 35th (Republican Party) Congress sessions. Brenton died during the 35th Congress and was replaced by Charles Case.
