## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Annie Paul (Livermore) was born in 1832 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to Rebecca Sparks Hillman (1818-1893) and David Sutterly Paul (1812-1893). Her mother was fourteen years old. Annie was the oldest of nine children. Her siblings were Joseph H. Paul (1837), Mary A. Paul (Schull) (1839), Charlotte B. Paul (Ale) (1840), David R. Paul (1842), William Jeffries Paul (1846), Howard W. Paul (1851-1875), Harry Bartholomew Paul (1855-1901) and Wesley D. Paul (1860). When Wesley was born, Annie was twenty-eight and her mother, Rebecca, was forty-two years old. Annie married Thomas Livermore (1831) in 1854 in Camden, New Jersey. Thomas had a partnership in a wool mill in 1866. She had two children, Harry Livermore (1854) and Ella Livermore (1857). At the time the letters were written, she resided in Valparaiso, Indiana. Not much is known about her life as the wife of a mill owner and mother of two. The census of 1870 places her in Camden, New Jersey. She died in Camden, New Jersey. Her date of death is unknown.

Ralph Buckley was married to Sarah Buckley. He was part owner of a wool mill in New Albany in 1866.

Sarah Buckley was born in 1824 in England. She married Ralph Buckley. In 1866, she was residing in Media, Pennsylvania.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT**

The Sarah Buckley letters include six letters written to Sarah Buckley in the years 1866-1867. Annie Livermore writes three of the letters mostly discussing news from the mills their husbands work with and news of their children. Ralph Buckley, her husband, writes two of the letters with news from the mills and an inquiry about her mother. Annie Crawford writes a single letter as a condolence for the death of Sarah's mother. Annie also informs Sarah of the state of her family as well and some news of the mill's administration changes.
