Friends, Society of Baltimore Yearly Meeting is a gathering of Friends, or "Quakers." The meetings started in April of 1672 south of present day Annapolis, making it the first Yearly Meeting in the Americas. George Fox, the founder of Society of Friends, was in attendance and approved of the meeting. In 1785, the meetings were moved to Baltimore. The Baltimore Yearly Meetings still occurs today.
