#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Stephen E. Pefley was chief photographer for WISH-TV in Indianapolis.

Stephen "Steve" Emanuel Pefley was born on 16 March 1920 in Zion, Illinois. At the time of the 1930 census, he was living in Zion with an aunt and uncle. In the 1940 census he is shown living in Des Moines, Iowa, and working as a salesman. He served in the U.S. Army from 1943 to 1946 during World War II, receiving the Bronze Star for his service.

On 28 December 1948 he married Ruth Marie Downs. At the time of the 1950 census, they were living in Zion, and he was working as a shipping clerk for an office supply company. The couple had two children, Deborah and Gary.

By 1955 Steve was living in Indianapolis, working as a photographer for WISH-TV.

Stephen Pefley died on 8 February 2004 in Edgewood, Kentucky.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of seven boxes of photographs by Stephen E. Pefley that depict many places throughout the state of Indiana as well as events such as festivals, arts and crafts shows, parades, and races. Tourism is a big theme of this collection, which includes portraits of people who worked for the state's Department of Commerce's Tourism Division. There are photographs of politicians such as Governor Roger D. Branigin, Lieutenant Governor Robert L. Rock, Senator Birch Bayh, Senator Vance Hartke, and Lieutenant Governor Richard E. Folz. There are also three folders of records kept by the photographer.

All photographs are black-and-white except for one small series of color photos. Many of the photographs are contact prints from various sizes of film -35mm,  $2\frac{1}{4}$ , and 4x5. Many of these prints have writing on them, such as a number from the photographer's numbering system and/or other identifying information. The photographs were removed from three-ring binders. Duplicates, often with a darker or lighter exposure, were found in different binders with different information.

The collection is arranged into four series:

Series 1: Photographers Records – this is composed of three folders of written records with some identifying information about the photographs.

Series 2: Photographs 5 to 448 – this includes a wide variety of topics; the photos are arranged numerically using the photographer's numbering system.

Series 3: Industrial Photographs, A-100 to A-130 – this series has a numbering system that appears to be separate from the previous system. These photographs depict industrial businesses and workers in various parts of Indiana.

Series 4: 1970 Photographs, 70-01 to 70-809-14 – this series also appears to have a different numbering system. These photos are believed to have all been taken in 1970 and cover a wide variety of topics.

Do a keyword search to find all photographs of a particular subject because some views of the same subject are scattered in different parts of the collection, which is arranged based on the photographer's numbering system.
