BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

John H. Stotsenburg was born ca. 1833 in Wilmington, Delaware. Sometime before 1870, he moved to New Albany, Floyd County, Indiana to practice law. Around 1890, Stotsenburg retired from the law and established a 1,200 acre orchard twenty-five miles north of New Albany in Clark County, Indiana. The trees produced peaches, plums, apples, quinces, and cherries.
