HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Green Feather Movement was a short-lived college protest directed against McCarthyism. In November of 1953, Mrs. Thomas J. White, of the Indiana Textbook Commission, called for the ban of the story of *Robin Hood* from all school textbooks because of its Communistic theme of robbing from the rich and giving to the poor. In response to her attempts at censorship, on March 1, 1954 five Indiana University students-Barnard Bray, Mary Dawson, Edwin Napier, Blas Davila and Jeanine Carter, collected six large burlap bags of chicken feathers from a local poultry farm, dyed them green to represent the feathers allegedly worn in the hats of Robin Hood and his followers, and spread them throughout the Bloomington Campus. The students called themselves Robin Hood's Merry Men and also circulated anonymous protest papers against censorship throughout the campus and owned up to their actions in letters to *The Indiana Daily Student*, Indiana University's student newspaper.

Students at other colleges learned of their activities through articles in both local and college newspapers and ordered literature, protest buttons, and green feathers from the Bloomington students. Within the course of several weeks the protest mushroomed into a nationwide campus movement. Green Feather groups were formed at the universities of Harvard, Michigan, Illinois, Chicago, and UCLA.

The Green Feather Movement came to an end in December of 1954 when Senator McCarthy was censured by the United States Senate.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection is made up of one manuscript box of folders containing materials from the Green Feather Movement at Indiana University at Bloomington dating from March and April of 1954. Materials included in Series 1 are a Green Feather statement of belief, handwritten notes on Green Feather activities entitled "Robin Hood Report", correspondence with other college protest groups, a printed sermon given by Rev. W. Douglas Rae to the congregation of First Baptist Church, Bloomington, copies of telegrams to Indiana University President Herman B Wells, Fliers and book marks, and receipts and invoices for badges and buttons.

Series 2 is one oversize manuscript folder which containing newspapers and a magazine article from November 1953 to April 1954, and one from March 2005 commemorating the 51st anniversary of the Green Feather Movement.
