BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

William Hedge Creager lived in Merom, Sullivan County, Indiana. He owned a general store in that town around the 1820s and 1830s. It is quite possible that this is the same William Creager that is listed in the 1860 Census as being born in Kentucky about 1802. He is also listed that year as a 58 year-old farmer, with wife Margaret and children John, Dice, and Margaret. Exact dates for which he owned or worked at the store could not be determined.
