BIOGRAPICAL SKETCH

William Riley Ennis (18 May 1925–24 May 2008) was born to Minor and Ida Brummett Ennis in Indianapolis. Minor Ennis worked as a painter/contractor, and the family, which included seven siblings (Verbal, Everett, Rosetta, Marjorie, Jack, Philip, and Harry), resided on the east side of Indianapolis.

William attended Arsenal Technical High School, where he played on the football team. He enrolled in the Reserve Officers Training Corps while in high school and then transitioned into naval training upon his graduation. He served on the U.S.S. Gunston Hall as a Machinist until he was honorably discharged in May 1946.

While in the Navy, William married Catheryn Scanlon in Portland, Oregon, on 6 October 1945. The couple settled back in Indianapolis and had three children: William II, Linda, and Donna. William worked for the family business, Ennis Brothers Paint Contractors. He was an active square dancer, RV enthusiast, and member of the Old Bethel United Methodist Church and Masonic Lodge #669.

Catheryn Scanlon Ennis (12 August 1925–7 July 2008) was born to Joseph and Blanche Fitch Scanlon in Scottsburg, Indiana. She had two siblings, Josephine and Edward. The Scanlon family moved to Indianapolis in 1936. Catheryn graduated from George Washington High School in 1943. She was a homemaker for William and their three children. Her activities included serving as a Den Mother in the Cub Scouts and also serving as secretary and treasurer of the Coachmen Camping Club. Additionally, she was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star and the Old Bethel Methodist Church.
