The national Woman's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church was established in 1880 in Cincinnati, Ohio. The organization initially was formed to aid women in the South and the West, Mormon women, and missionaries throughout the country. In Indiana, the society raised funds for the establishment of Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis from 1907-1908, and in 1912, they established an Italian Mission in the same city.
